Elective Subject Fees for 2021

The following elective subjects charge fees to cover are to cover consumable materials students create and take possession. Students utilise ingredients or materials throughout the whole year in their respective subject area. These materials/ingredients also form part of their practical outcomes for assessment.

In some electives the fee covers day excursions and overnight camps. See individual subject page for further information on the activities involved.

Note: Goods specially ordered in for individuals for their class project, in any elective subjects, are charged on top of the base semester fee below.

Don't forget if you hold a current health care card or pension card, you may be eligible, for the Camps Sport & Excursion Fund (CSEF) (\$225 per student) available through the Department. This fund can only be allocated to the cost of camps, excursion and sporting events. CSEF cannot be allocated against any other charge on your account. Application forms are available at the College Office. Centre Pay is also a great way to pay off your school fees. Many eligible families have set up payment plans through Centre Pay for deductions of between \$20 and \$80 per fortnight. These deductions are paid directly to the school and unlike CSEF, can be allocated against any charge on your account. It is surprising how quickly your balance reduces when making regular payments. Application forms are available at the Office for Centre Pay. State School Relief can also support eligible families with the purchase of uniforms and other educational items, ask at the office if you would like further information.

APPROXIMATE COST OF OVERNIGHT CAMPS.

Note all camps must be paid in full at least two week prior to attending the camp.

Students who have not paid by the due date, will not be allowed to participate unless payment arrangements have been made in advance. See Payment Policy below.

Year 7 Camp – held in term one. In 2021 the camp will be held at the Rubicon Outdoor Centre.

This camp is for **all** Year 7 students \$140

Year 8 Camp - to Melbourne usually held in term 2 \$230

Yr 9 Prom Hikes \$70

Year 9 Community Program run a Bronze Camp at Sandy Point at the end of the year and a camp to Melbourne to feed the homeless at the end of the year. The cost of these camps is mostly covered by the \$100 annual levy.

Year 10 Camp – to Inverloch usually end of term 3 \$120

VCE Camp - to Melbourne usually end of term 2 \$250

Elective Based Camps

Senior Music Tour (not every year) \$300 - \$500 depending on destination

Outdoor Environmental Studies Unit 3 & 4 Ski Camp included in OES Levy

Throughout the year, many day excursions are organised for the different learning areas. The cost is between \$10 and \$120, depending on the individual event and destination. Interschool sport days are \$10 per student per event if travelling to another school or to another region. Parents will receive at least 12 months notice if an overseas trip is being organised, to allow time to pay the trip off over that period.

CAMPS & EXCURSIONS POLICY

Payment

4.1 Students are to pay fully for a major camp or excursion at least two weeks before the camp or excursion takes place.

4.2 Students are to pay fully for a minor camp or excursion at least two days before the camp or excursion takes place.

4.3 The Principal and Business Manager will determine whether the camp or excursion is to be considered a major or minor one.

4.4 All requests for delayed or time payments are to be taken to the Business Manager for approval.

4.5 All payments are to be made to the General Office where a receipt will be issued.

Withdrawal and cancellation

5.1 Where a student withdraws from a camp or excursion, a medical certificate is to be required for a refund. If students withdraw without a certificate, it is the prerogative of the Principal/Business Manager to determine whether the deposit is refunded or not.
